- Ignition Interlock Device-Warrior Auto Works
 - Demonstration and Question/Answer

Darrin from Warrior brought his product and showed how this was installed and how it works-the basics anyway! He brought with him flyers regarding the DMB Interlock Device. Darrin reports that this is a Product of Drager, which makes medical instruments in addition to the Interlock Device. He reports that at .025 the unit will not allow the auto to start and that it can be set lower. The basic cost is \$120.00 to install. He reports that the auto will need to be brought back in every 30 days for calibration. Every 30 days to the date, otherwise if they are late, it costs \$35.00 a day for each day after 30 AND that after seven days the auto will not start at all. He spoke about rolling tests, meaning that the auto is running and asks for a breath test while the auto is running. He cautioned that they do not shut off an already running auto, as that would be a hazard. He also spoke about the fact that if a person fails this test three times, then the auto will be locked and unable to start until someone from DMB comes and enters a four digit code. He discussed the fact that this could be very expensive if that person is out of town or out of state when that happens. He says that fail tests will either be due to 1) not blowing correctly 2) Breath alcohol failure or 3) tampering with the unit. He reports that this can be used by others than just individual's court ordered to install the device. He hopes to promote voluntary use of this product! The cost would then be \$1000.00 for installation and \$80.00 a month (includes lease payment, warranty of the product, and monthly calibration costs). It costs \$40.00 for removal. He encouraged for it fleet vehicles and trucking companies. He spoke about insurance discounts for voluntary use and we hope to learn more about these types of discounts, which would further promote voluntary use. Lonie brought up the Interim Committee and the fact that they are currently looking at making those with a first time DUI offenses and how this would increase the need for companies such as Warrior Auto. Darrin reports that he would like to be able to offer his services not only in Missoula County, but also in the surrounding counties as well. Darrin feels that this is a great prevention tool and one that can certainly save lives. Darrin will speak again at the March 24th DUI Task Force Meeting! Please come listen to his presentation...learn about the product, how it works and why Darrin and Warrior Auto are installing these!

He reports that he and his Team from Warrior Auto Works will all be present for the March 24th event, including members from the corporate office (DMB)!
